The Big Blue hosted the Big Red today in the Andover pool for the 36<sup>th</sup> meeting of these two competitors. The Blue rallied most of the meet, but was upset in the final relay of the day.

Highlights included:

The fastest 200 Medley Relay we have swum to date: 1:53.18 for the team of Teri Faller '11, Salena Casha '09, Annie Glancy '09 and Alanna Waldman '10.

In the 200 Free, we saw the resurgence of Kristen Faulkner '11 with a time of 2:01.67 followed closely by Allie Hall '10 in 2:02.15.

Casha took top spot in the 200 IM with a time of 2:12.10 while Julia Torabi '12 took third with 2:17.48.

The team went 2-3-4 in the 50 free with Peyton Morss '10, Waldman and Lexi Moroney '11.

Kendall MacRae '11 posted a new pool record in diving with a top place score of 250.30 – just a hair away from the 1985 school record of 251.50. Emily Johnson '10 took second with 237 points.

The 100 fly brought a second place finish for Glancy with a time of 1:01.75.

Faller and Morss and Moroney took 2-3-5 in the 100 free while Allie Hall took first in the 500 followed by Faulkner in third.

A 1-3 finish in the 200 Free Relay was a huge hit for the day. The team of Moroney, Waldman, Molly Levene '11 and Morss came in a 1:43.45 while Julianna Reider '10, Emily Timm '11, Mai Kristofferson '09 and Kristen Faulkner came in at 1:45.12.

A 3-5 finish in the 100 back followed by a 2-4-5 finish in the breaststroke set up a score of 87.5 to 84.5 going into the final relay. The big blue needed just 2-3 to win.

Second place was posted by Faulkner, Moroney, Casha and Morss with a time of 3:45.26....but the third place just did not happen.

The girls are ready to take on the league in the New England Championships on Sunday March 8 at The Hotchkiss School. It appears to be setting up for a battle of the blue and the red one more time!
